I am Ellen Margaret Reneta Marcotte, known to most as Ellie. I am a member of the Wolf Clan and the great granddaughter of Chief Johnathan of Fort Selkirk. My grandparents were Edward Simon and Margaret Simon, and my parents were Rena Simon (Profeit) and Lawrence (Larry) Profeit.

I was born and raised in the Yukon and have spent much of my life on the land hunting, fishing, and doing land-based activities. I spent many years at our family fish camp, where I introduced my children to doöli and the teachings that were given to me.

I also served for 18 years as a Canadian Ranger and helped cut the Yukon Quest Trail over several winters. Through decades on the land, I have seen firsthand the effects of climate change and know sustainability is a top priority in protecting our culture for generations to come.

I bead and work with leather, skills passed down from my mother, creating moccasins, vests, hats, and handmade purses.

I have worked in lands, social services, and as an Elders Coordinator. I also served as a mining manager during the ongoing reclamation of the Faro mine site. My practical land knowledge, combined with my post-secondary education completed in Alberta and BC, equips me to advocate for our people and our future.


